REQUEST FOR EVIDENCE

This office is unable to complete the processing of your petition without further information. Please read and comply with the request below, then submit the evidence to the above address. Include a copy of this letter and place the attached gold sheet on top of your documents,

The petitioner has filed Form I-140 for an alien applying for a National Interest Waiver who is a member of the professions holding an advanced degree or an alien of exceptional ability. The priority date for this petition is November 18, 2011.

1. The petitioner must establish that the beneficiary holds an advanced degree as of the priority date. The beneficiary provided a copy of the beneficiary's degree, but it did a certified English translation of the diploma or a copy of the transcript showing the beneficiary's years of attendance.

This evidence may consist of the following documentation:

A copy of the beneficiary's official academic record, showing that the beneficiary has a U.S. advanced degree (or a foreign equivalent degree), the dates of attendance, area of concentration of study, and the date the beneficiary received the degree. Please also submit a complete copy of the beneficiary's transcripts to show the major area of study; or

Since the beneficiary completed his education outside the United States, in addition to the beneficiary's official academic record, please submit a detailed advisory evaluation of the beneficiary's credentials. This evaluation is necessary to determine the level and major field of the beneficiary's education in terms of equivalent education in the United States. An acceptable evaluation should:

- Consider formal education only, and not practical training or experience;
- State whether the beneficiary completed the United States equivalent of high school before entering college; the years of attendance to receive the degree;
- Provide a detailed explanation of the evaluated material, rather than a simple conclusive statement;

Briefly state the evaluator's qualifications and experience

2. If any document is in a foreign language, then it must be submitted along with a certified English translation. The translator must certify that he/she is competent to perform the translation and that

the translation is accurate. Translations submitted without the related foreign document are not acceptable.

You must submit the requested information within eighty-four (84) days from the date of this letter (87 days if this notice was received by mail). Failure to do so may result in the denial of your petition.

Please note the required deadline for providing a response to this Request for Evidence. The deadline reflects the maximum period for responding to this RFE. However, since many immigration benefits are time sensitive, you are encouraged to respond to this request as early as possible but no later than the date provided on the request.
